Example: Suspense and conflict

Or the longer version: conflict "means, simply, that the story contains someone or something struggling with someone or something and the outcome is in doubt." Action = happenings (around that struggle). Suspense = uncertainty (related to that struggle). The conflict catches the reader's attention.
