After the conquest, French largely displaced English as the language of the upper classes and of sophisticated literature.

By 1359 Chaucer was a member of Edward III 's army in France and was captured during the unsuccessful siege of Reims. The king contributed to his ransom, and Chaucer served as messenger from Calais to England during the peace negotiations of 1360. Chaucer does not appear in any contemporary record during 1361-65.
