Valuation Analysis Definition

$DZ = (1 - b) \times E2 = (1 - b) \times E1 \times (1 + b \times ROE) = D1 \times (1 + b \times ROE)$ \Rightarrow dividend per share grows at rate $b \times ROE$ (since payout ratio is constant) So, if b and ROE are constant, all per share values grow at rate $g = ROE \times b$.
