However, in the late 60s, and particularly in the 70s, the study of errors in non-native language performance, or Errors Analysis (EA), assumed a new role in applied linguistics. Error analysis (hereafter EA) is a model for the study of second language learners' errors. Richards & Schmidt (2002) defined EA as a technique for identifying, classifying and systematically interpreting the unacceptable forms of a language in the production data of someone learning either a second or foreign language.

Some errors may be first language interference or an overgeneralization of a second language rule. Second, as the second language learner increases in level, the ability to avoid problematic structures becomes more common.

A mistake can be self-corrected, but errors can not. Mistakes are manifest in slip of the tongue, random ungrammaticalities and other performance lapse that are common to both native speakers and second language speakers. Errors are 'systematic,' i.e. likely to occur repeatedly and not recognized by the learner.

Contrastive analysis(CA) can predict these difficulties which a learner faces in learning the TL.
