Levels of Evidence. Evidence-based practice is a conscientious, problem-solving approach to clinical practice that incorporates the best evidence from well-designed studies, patient values and preferences, and a clinician's expertise in making decisions about a patient's care. Unfortunately, no standard formula exists for how much these factors should be weighed in the clinical decision-making process.

If guidelines are to be based on evidence of effective practice, a prerequisite is high quality evidence of the benefits, harms, and costs of the targeted procedures and practices. Further research into the effectiveness of nursing practice and interventions is needed to provide this evidence base.

When all three components of EBP are considered together, clinicians can make informed, evidence-based decisions and provide high-quality services reflecting the interests, values, needs, and choices of individuals with communication disorders.

Evidence-based practice: Leads to highest quality care and patient outcomes. Reduces health care costs. Reduces geographic variations in the delivery of care. Increases healthcare provider empowerment and role satisfaction. Reduces healthcare provider turnover rate. Increases reimbursement from 3rd party payers.
