Primum non nocere is the Latin phrase that means "first, do no harm." This is a commonly taught principle in healthcare. In fact, the Hippocratic Oath, taken by doctors, promises they will abstain from doing harm to their patients.

Do No Harm! How does this relate to Situational Awareness?

A literal reading of "first do no harm" would, therefore, lead the clinician to do nothing at all. A more accurate formulation is "first do no net harm." The Latin translation does not roll off the tongue: "primum non plus nocere quam succurrere" ("above all, do not harm more than succour").
