The keyboard provides a visual way to link the theory to a real sound, and to see the intervals (steps between the notes) as you play them. When you first try to read a piece of music, you should approach it in a systematic way. Look out for the visual clues before attempting to play.

How To Read Music Made Easy

A quick easy way to get started reading sheet music is to focus on counting intervals based on landmark notes. The three notes that make the most sense to use are middle C, bass F, and treble G. Middle C is directly in the middle of bass F and treble G, and so counting notes within each staff from those landmark notes makes note reading faster.

When looking at sheet music the staff is where all of your notes will be located. The staff is made up of 5 lines - a note placed on each of those lines or in the spaces between those lines represents a different note. Which notes those lines represent depends on whether we you are playing on a treble clef or a bass clef.

The Notes on the Lines. The easiest way to learn violin music notes is to divide the staff up into lines and spaces. These are the notes that fall on the lines of the staff, meaning the notes directly on top of the lines, with the lines intersecting them.

A basic set of note values include the whole note, dotted half note, half note and quarter note. In a single piece of music a composer will use a variety of rhythmic values. The WHOLE NOTE receives 4 BEATS (Count 1-2-3-4) The DOTTED HALF NOTE receives 3 BEATS (Count 1-2-3)

Observe the lines and spaces. Notes are placed on a line or a space. When you reach the top or bottom of the staff, a little line called a ledger line is added to the note to continue the pattern of line, space, line, space. Learn your musical alphabet forwards and backwards.

MUSIC NOTES Each line and space of the staff is assigned a note. This note, assigned a line or space, is always found in the same place. The first line, or bottom line, will always be the music note E.
