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Literary criticism advances a particular argument about a specific text or a set of texts, so literary criticism should be persuasive. The first step in formulating a critical argument is to assume a rhetorical stance that engages a type, school, or approach of literary criticism.

Literary Criticism. "Literary criticism" refers to the act of interpreting and studying literature. A literary critic is someone who argues on behalf of an interpretation or understanding of the particular meaning (s) of literary texts. The task of a literary critic is to explain and attempt to reach a critical understanding of what literary texts mean in terms of their aesthetic, as well as social, political, and cultural statements and suggestions.

Reader-response criticism, or reader-oriented criticism, focuses on the reading process. As Charles Bressler notes in *Literary Criticism*, the basic assumption of reader-oriented criticism is "Reader + Text = Meaning" (80).
