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Objective Question Paper On Abstract

Your abstract should be intelligible on its own, without a reader's having to read your entire paper. And in an abstract, you usually do not cite references—most of your abstract will describe what you have studied in your research and what you have found and what you argue in your paper. In the body of your paper, you will cite the specific literature that informs your research.

How to write and format an APA abstract. Published on October 31, 2018 by Courtney Gahan. Revised on January 24, 2020. An APA abstract is a summary of your paper in 150–250 words. It describes the research problem, methods, results and conclusions of your research. For published papers, it also includes a list of keywords.

The objective, problem statement, and/or research questions are stated. The methodology is briefly described. The most important results are summarized. The main conclusions are stated. Any recommendations and/or suggestions for further research are mentioned. The abstract can be understood by someone without prior knowledge of the topic.

The main purpose of your abstract is to lead researchers to the full text of your research paper. In scientific journals, abstracts let readers decide whether the research discussed is relevant to their own interests or study. Abstracts also help readers understand your main argument quickly. An abstract must also be objective and accurate. The abstract's purpose is to report rather than provide commentary. It should accurately reflect what your paper is about. Only include information that is also included in the body of your paper.

How to Write an Abstract in APA Format

A thesis and an abstract are entirely different things. The thesis of a paper introduces the main idea

or question, while the abstract works to review the entirety of the paper, including the methods and results. Even if you think that you know what your paper is going to be about, always save the abstract for last.

Also, this abstract doesn't overtly state the implications. It states only that the paper discusses the implications. While in most cases it's better to briefly summarize the results of the study, sometimes it's impossible to summarize the information in only a few sentences.
